⁹ It is an island situated in the Baltic Sea in the proximity of the mainland. Åland is one of the provinces of Finland and it has been granted a provincial autonomy. The Parliament of Åland exercises legislative power within the framework permitted by its autonomous position. Otherwise, the laws enacted by Finland's Parliament apply. According to the Act on the Autonomy of Åland section 27 the State (Finland's Parliament) shall have legislative power in matters relating to insurance contracts which means that the act governing motor liability insurance shall be applicable also in Åland.

¹⁰ The Transnistrian Region falls outside the de facto control of the Republic of Moldova.

Republic of Moldova is a sovereign and independent state, the territory integrity of which is recognized by all members of the International Community which are the subjects of the international law. The Government of the Republic of Moldova, central and local authorities of public administration repeatedly declares that the clauses of the international agreements, as well as the ensuing obligations, are equally applied and valid on the both banks of the Dniester River, as well as on the whole Moldovan territory. As the International Community and the Moldovan Government don't recognize the separatism of the Transnistrian region and consider this area being part of the Moldavian state territory, the National Bureau of Motor Insurers of Moldova extends its competence on the mentioned region accordingly. In this respect, the National Bureau's members issue Green Card policies for the vehicles with Transnistrian registration plates, but only with insurance territorial cover for Russia, Ukraine and Belarus (Green Cards for so called Zone I and Zone II) – countries which are accepting the circulation on their territory of vehicles with such registration plates.

On the same note and taking into account that European Union States don't accept the circulation of the vehicles with Transnistrian registration plates on their territory, our members don't issue for them Green Card policies valid for all Green Card System member states (Green Cards for so called Zone III). Despite all political aspects of the issue referring to Transnistrian region, the National Bureau of Moldova remains in force responsible for all financial obligations arising from Green Card insurance claims and provides its handling and guaranteeing competences for covering damages caused on the Transnistrian area to the foreign persons/vehicles registered abroad and respectively, for covering damages caused abroad by a Green Card policy holder driving a vehicle with Transnistrian registration plate, as well as for false Green Cards under the provisions of art.9 of Internal Regulations CoB.
